False Hellebore

Veratrum viride

False Hellebore is a member of the lily family. The long stalk with a spike of green flowers can grow up to 8 feet tall in late July. Its highly textured parallel-veined leaves are tempting to touch, but this plant is very poisonous - so be careful. False hellebore contains toxic alkaloids that cause vomiting, diarrhea, stomach pain and depression of heart functions.
